### **Responsible Department:**

Academic Affairs

### **Definitions**:

**Student:** any person who is taking or auditing classes (including non-credit) at the College or is enrolled in any College program, including students enrolled in distance learning majors.

#### **Policy:**

- I. A student in the classroom is to be evaluated solely on his/her academic performance, not on the basis of his/her opinions or conduct in matters unrelated to academic standards.
  - a. Academic performance is to be evaluated in accordance with the grading standards and rubrics identified in the course syllabus.
  - b. Evaluation of individual papers, exams, quizzes, and laboratory/clinical skills is to be based on specific, pre-established standards.
  - c. Evaluations of academic performance are not to be negatively or positively influenced by a perceived agreement/disagreement of opinion, or by biases relating to politics, personal interests, religion, or any other characteristic prohibited by nondiscrimination laws.
- II. The instructor, in the classroom and in individual conference, is to encourage free discussion, inquiry, and expression.
  - a. Students are free to take reasoned exception to the data or views offered in any course of study and to reserve judgment about debatable issues; however, students are responsible for understanding the content of any course in which they are enrolled.
  - b. The protection does not extend to any form of verbal abuse, harassment, or threats, which are prohibited by the Student Code of Conduct, <u>PR 4.43</u>.
- III. The instructor, in the classroom and in individual conference, is to practice consistent and fair treatment of all students, without bias or favoritism.

IV. Students who feel they have been subject to improper/unfair academic evaluation or treatment may file a complaint as outlined in the Academic Fairness Complaint Procedure, <u>PR 4.23</u>.
