

**PATHWAY AGREEMENT FOR HIGH SCHOOLS, CAREER TECHNOLOGY CENTERS (CTC), AND CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION (CTE) SENDING INSTITUTIONS BETWEEN**

**PENNSYLVANIA COLLEGE OF TECHNOLOGY**

**AND**

**EASTERN MONROE CAREER CENTER**

This Pathway Agreement establishes a mechanism for students of Eastern Monroe Career Center to earn credit at Pennsylvania College of Technology within the Collision Repair (CR), Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree.

Course credit will be awarded using the following three-step process:

1. Students must complete the Eastern Monroe Career Center Collision Repair Technology coursework with a final grade of B or better (3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale). This will be verified by reviewing the following courses on the high school transcript:
  - a. Basic Collision Repair Technology (Year 1)
  - b. Advanced Collision Repair Technology (Year 2)
2. Students who satisfy item one will be awarded AMT2003 – Collision Repair Elective (ABC ELC) – 3 credits.
3. Students who satisfy item one are also eligible for additional credit via I-CAR certifications provided to Penn College. This is a block transfer and all listed I-CAR certifications are required to receive the Penn College credit listed below.

**Additional Transfer Information**

- Students must have gained admission to Penn College and met placement requirements.
- Students must complete coursework with a grade of B or better (3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale).
- Penn College will accept Eastern Monroe Career Center coursework for Penn College credit for students who enroll at the College within two (2) academic years of graduation from Eastern Monroe Career Center.

- Students must submit their final official Eastern Monroe Career Center transcript to Penn College prior to enrollment in order to receive credit for their Eastern Monroe Career Center coursework. Students must also submit documentation of all I-CAR Certifications listed in the agreement, if applicable.
- Penn College will only consider those credits earned through Eastern Monroe Career Center for the terms of this agreement. Students must request transcripts from additional institutions to be evaluated on an individual basis at Penn College.
- Credits will post on the student's official academic transcript upon the successful completion of twelve (12) credits of academic work at Penn College. Prior to completion of twelve (12) credits, for advising and scheduling purposes, approved credits will show on working copies of the student's academic transcript and on the student's graduation profile. Whether Penn College credits will be accepted by another college or university is at the discretion of the receiving college or university.
