PENNSYLVANIA COLLEGE OF TECHNOLOGY

AND

BERMUDIAN SPRINGS HIGH SCHOOL

**Secondary Classification of Instructional Program (CIP) 52.0302 –
Accounting Technology/Technician and Bookkeeping**

This agreement establishes a mechanism for students of Bermudian Springs High School to earn credit for the below defined coursework at Penn College in **Accounting**, B.S. (BSA or ACO) or **Accounting**, A.A.S. (BA or AW).

Additional Transfer Information

- Students must have gained admission to Penn College and met placement requirements.
- Penn College will accept Bermudian Springs High School coursework for Penn College credit for students who enroll at the College within two (2) academic years of graduation from Bermudian Springs High School.
- Students must demonstrate they have met the required competencies for the Secondary Classification of Instructional Program (CIP) 52.0302 – Accounting Technology/Technician and Bookkeeping. Documentation to Penn College must include all the following items:
 - Final official Bermudian Springs High School transcript to Penn College prior to enrollment to receive credit for their Bermudian Springs High School coursework.
 - Official transcript showing a minimum cumulative GPA of 'C' (2.0 on a 4.0 scale).
 - Completed *Pathway Agreement Secondary Competency Task List* units as signed by the technical program instructor. All tasks must be achieved to industry proficiency level.
- Penn College will only consider those credits earned through Bermudian Springs High School for the terms of this agreement. Students must request transcripts from additional institutions to be evaluated on an individual basis at Penn College.
- Credits will post on the student's official academic transcript upon the successful completion of twelve (12) credits of academic work at Penn College. Prior to completion of twelve (12) credits, for advising and scheduling purposes, approved credits will show on working copies of the student's academic transcript and on the student's graduation profile. Whether Penn College credits will be accepted by another college or university is at the discretion of the receiving college or university.
