This Pathway Agreement establishes a mechanism for students of Clarion County Career Center to earn credit at Pennsylvania College of Technology within the Automotive Technology (A.A.S.), Automotive Technology: Honda PACT Emphasis (A.A.S.), Automotive Service Sales & Marketing (A.A.S.), and Automotive Service Technician (certificate) programs.

Additional Transfer Information

- Students must have gained admission to Penn College and met placement requirements.
- Students must complete coursework with a grade of B or better (3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale).
- Penn College will accept Clarion County Career Center coursework for Penn College credit for students who enroll at the College within two (2) academic years of graduation from Clarion County Career Center.
- Students must submit a copy of their final official Clarion County Career Center transcript to
 Penn College prior to enrollment in order to receive credit for their Clarion County Career
 Center coursework which identifies the Automotive Mechanics Program of Study or coursework.
 Additionally, students must submit evidence of their PA Vehicle Safety Inspection Certificate.
- Penn College will only consider those credits earned through Clarion County Career Center for the terms of this agreement. Students must request transcripts from additional institutions to be evaluated on an individual basis at Penn College.
- Credits will post on the student's official academic transcript upon the successful completion of twelve (12) credits of academic work at Penn College. Whether Penn College credits will be accepted by another college or university is at the discretion of the receiving college or university.
