

→ SUMMER MAKERSPACE MEMBERSHIPS

This summer the Makerspace will be open for use by Penn College students, faculty, and staff with the same hours as during the school year: Monday–Thursday, 5-10 p.m. and Friday, noon-5 p.m. As always, use of the Makerspace and its materials are free to the Penn College community. However, this summer the makerspace is piloting a new initiative; during June and July only, the Makerspace will also be available to the broader community with the payment of a membership fee:

- **\$10 per day – Penn College alumni and immediate family members of Penn College students, faculty, and staff**
- **\$15 per day – All others**

Those who will be using the Makerspace via paid membership are encouraged to bring their own materials. If paid members wish to use the Makerspace's materials they will pay a \$5 materials fee per day per piece of equipment being used, with the exception of supplies for woodworking and metalworking—due to the extreme variability of cost of these supplies, paid members must bring their own wood and metal.

The Makerspace cannot accept cash or checks. Payments will be made via credit card. Money earned will be used for future makerspace equipment purchases.

Users will be required to sign a liability waiver the first time they visit the space. Those under 18 years of age must be accompanied by an adult and will not be able to use equipment on the workshop-side of the makerspace. For safety reasons, children under 4 are not allowed in the Makerspace.

Badging (a one-time equipment certification/training process) is required before using equipment in the woodshop, machining area, and welding room. Badged users will be issued an access card that activates the equipment on which they are badged.

Training and assistance in the use of equipment and software is always available to all users of the Makerspace. However, over the summer the Makerspace will not be able to offer training in welding or metal machining.

All current Makerspace policies continue to apply, including policies regarding acceptable use of the space.
